Vendors in ROW Task Team – Chuck Gillick

Francine Bradley is the new Champion representing Navajo Nation DOT

Goal: to protect the traveling public and vendors by relocating the vendors from the side of the road to locations behind the ROW fence.

Issues/Concerns: ROW fences are damaged by vendors; blockage to roads and right-of-ways; issues with trash at vendor locations; usually no restroom available; no adequate facilities; ingress and egress to vendor sites are not built to current safety standards (lack of left and right turn lanes); loss of revenue to vendors due to relocation; law enforcement doesn't want to get involved.

Task Team Findings: ADOT operates the state highway system on the Navajo Nation Reservation under an easement with the Navajo Nation (see attachment); due to this easement it has no jurisdiction authority to remove vendors; an Intergovernmental Agreement between the Navajo Nation and ADOT, Navajo Nation Roadside Business Sites, No. 9678, was signed in 1984 but has never really been enforced by either party; ADOT cannot cite vendors.

Recommendations: Update IGA No. 9678 to reflect the agreed upon needs and responsibilities of both the Navajo Nation and ADOT to safely and effectively manage the state highway system and vendors who use it; utilize the Navajo Nation Division of Economic Development to begin the vendor relocation process with the updated IGA; work with the Animals in ROW Task Team on joint public information and educational opportunities.

Steering Committee Comment/Input:

- ◆ How long will it take to updated 1984 IGA?
 - ◆ If IGA is updated, Navajo Nation will be able to utilized agreement to change Nation laws regarding vendors
 - ◆ ADOT cannot get involved in changing laws; can only be involved in relocating/moving vendors out of ROW
 - ◆ 1st step is for ADOT to meet with Navajo Nation Land Use Committee
 - ◆ BIA post "NO VENDORS" signs and has process in place: grazing officials are involved and BIA works with chapters to identify vendor location

- ◆ ADOT does not have power to enforce laws/regulations on Navajo Nation

Action Items:

- ◆ ADOT and Navajo Nation Division of Economic Development will draft language to update IGA
 - ◆ ADOT will propose new updated IGA to add consequences if agreements are broken; ADOT will submit to Tom Platero for review and to submit to Navajo Nation's legislature, attorneys, and Economic Development
 - ◆ Chuck Gillick will have updated IGA ready by mid September 2009
 - ◆ Jonathan Nez will look into data base (eminent domain) for vendors/chapters and will submit to Chuck Gillick and Myra Rothman by next partnership meeting
 - ◆ Steering Committee recommends that task team move forward with updating IGA and with task team meetings

Animals in ROW Task Team – Lynn Johnson

Francine Bradley is the new Champion representing Navajo Nation DOT

Lynn presented a PowerPoint that was created to educate both ADOT and Navajo Nation on the dangers of animals not being fenced and in the right-of-way and roads (see attached PowerPoint)

Steering Committee Comment/Input:

- ◆ Possible partner with Navajo Nation Health Department to educate the public on how to take care of their pets/animals
- ◆ ADOT needs more and better statistics from Navajo Nation Police so we can get funding need to improve fencing, cattle guards, etc.
- ◆ Problem: Navajo Nation Police do not submit their accident reports to ADOT
- ◆ Task Team needs sponsorship at the Navajo Nation Legislative level
- ◆ Task Team needs to get to the next level
- ◆ Need to make contact with Navajo Nation Agriculture Department and inform them of Task Team's mission and goals

Resources Task Team – to include Natural Resources Sharing – Stan Robbins

Goals/Accomplishments:

1. Identified existing sand and gravel pits – Navajo Nation DOT GIS produced the sand & gravel maps; maps are being reviewed by Navajo Nation Minerals Department for accuracy
 2. Identified existing wells – Navajo Nation DOT GIS produced the water wells

- maps; maps are being reviewed by Navajo Nation Water Resource Department for accuracy
3. Identified Navajo Nation DOT 45 year roads improvement plan – Planning Department produced maps and are currently updating their maps
 4. ADOT 5 year roads improvement plan – information will be given to Eleanor Yazzie
 5. Apache County submitted a new inventory list to Navajo Nation – going through approval process
 6. Navajo County and Coconino County needs Navajo Nation school bus routes
 7. Identify new potential sand and gravel sites – ADOT 2007 SPR-500 Aggregate Sources for construction and maintenance for northern Arizona – project kick off is July 8, 2009; last update was October 27, 2008; due to the large data base and some data points may be duplicates; eliminate sites that are not of interest to the projects due to location, access, materials; final report will come at end of year
 8. Make roads a priority within the Navajo Nation Executive Branch – meeting with Navajo Nation Division of Natural Resources since February 28, 2009 to discuss stimulus package and 491 corridor; Division assigned Judy Welleto, Range Conservationist to work with the Task Team on sand and gravel inventory, map locating water, new locations for borrow, sand and gravel pits, review permitting and mineral leasing process and review general mining plan
 9. Stan Robbins met with Navajo Nation Vice President Ben Shelley on April 23, 2009 to establish a process for Navajo Nation DOT to obtain mineral leases, test the process on Teec Nos os Carrizo sand and gravel pit, complete the general mine plan as soon as possible, hire an engineer to and hire a consultant to help Navajo NationDOT complete the general mine plan for Carrizo.
 10. Stan Robbins held a second meeting with VP Shelley on May 11, 2009 to make Carrizo sand and gravel pit the primary source and get the mining plan completed by June 24, 2009
 11. Teec Nos Pos Chapter resolution – letter from Stan Robbins and Supervisor Jim Claw to Tom Platero to take over the miner leasing for Carrizo sand and gravel pit; Apache County turned over the survey maps, Arch clearance with compliance forms, EA, General Mine Plan and FONZI; Apache County turned this mineral lease acquisition over to NNDOT because the County and Navajo Nation could not agree on choice of law.
 12. Teec Nos Pos Chapter rescinded the resolution TNPCH-091-06R; authorized the Navajo Nation DOT to re-establish the 36.92 acre Carrizo sand and gravel pit and to obtain an approved sand and gravel lease including a 0.45 mile access easement to the gravel pit.
 13. Apache County and Navajo Nation DOT meet on June 14, 2009 at the Teec Nos Pos Chapter meeting – resolution tabled new Chapter Officials and wanted more information; special meeting to be held June 21, 2009.
 14. Francine Bradley and Stan Robbins did an overview with Larry Ute Joe and Patricia White – those that attended the meeting support the establishment of a gravel pit in their community – there was no quorum at this meeting so will have to bring the resolution back to the next Teec Nos Pos Chapter planning meeting on July 5, 2009.

Navajo Nation DOT Update – Tom Platero and Lemont Yazzie

- ◆ Navajo Nation DOT moving forward to becoming a Division; to become effective 3rd week of July
 - ◆ Navajo Nation DOT staff will be growing from 104 to 150 in the next two quarters; most of those employees will be located in the roads and maintenance section
 - ◆ Lemont presented a video of the design of new Navajo Nation DOT state of the art building, which will be located in New Mexico on N54/264; The Navajo Nation is \$13 million short for the new building – total cost to build is between \$15-\$19 million; new building will have a traffic operations center, which will have traffic cameras; there will be a War Room to manage

emergency and communications; Dire Murphy are the architects and are Navajo owned; construction to start August 2009 and will take 12-14 months to complete

- ◆ The 491 project is short \$158 million; the Navajo Nation is working to get the funding it needs
 - ◆ Lemont did a presentation on Real Time system – has the ability to work with this partnership to put all action items on the system and keep current; will work with Evonne on more details on how this partnership can utilize this system
