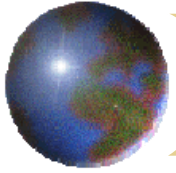

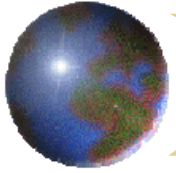

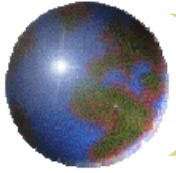

A Little FHWA History

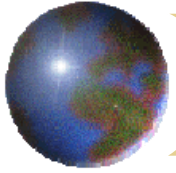
- Office of Road Inquiry (1893 – 1898)
- Office of Public Road Inquiries (1899 – (1905)
- Office of Public Roads (1905 – 1915)
- Office of Public and Rural Engineering (1915 – 1918)
- Bureau of Public Roads (1918 – 1939)
- Public Roads Administration (1939 – 1949)
- Bureau of Public Roads (1949 – 1967)
- Federal Highway Administration (April 1, 1967 – Present)



Significant Federal Highway Legislation

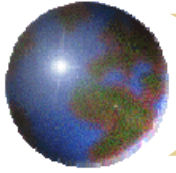
● Key Highway Laws:

- 1916 Act: Basic Fed-State format we have today
- 1944 Act: Identified the Interstate
- 1956 Act: Trust Fund Established
- 1973 : Funding categories established
- ISTEA : Change in FHWA program direction
- TEA-21: More \$\$\$, earmarks
- SAFETEA-LU: Current Law – More \$\$\$
- New Legislation Needed In 2009



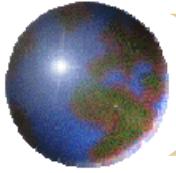

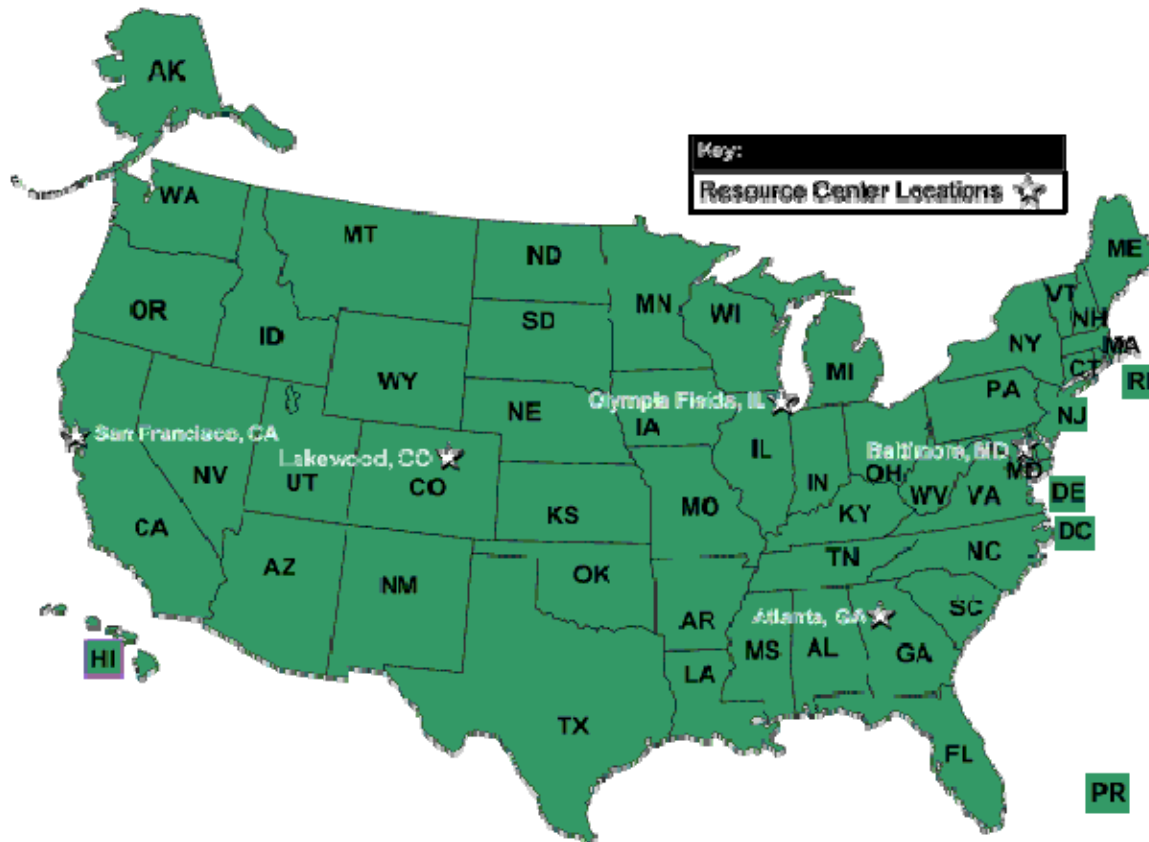


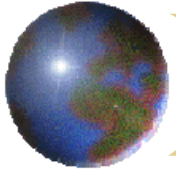
Federal Lands Highway Offices

- Administer the Federal Lands Program which includes forest highways, park roads and parklands, public lands, refuge roads and Indian reservation roads.
- Offices located in Sterling, Virginia, Lakewood, Colorado and Vancouver, Washington.



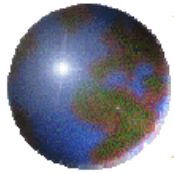

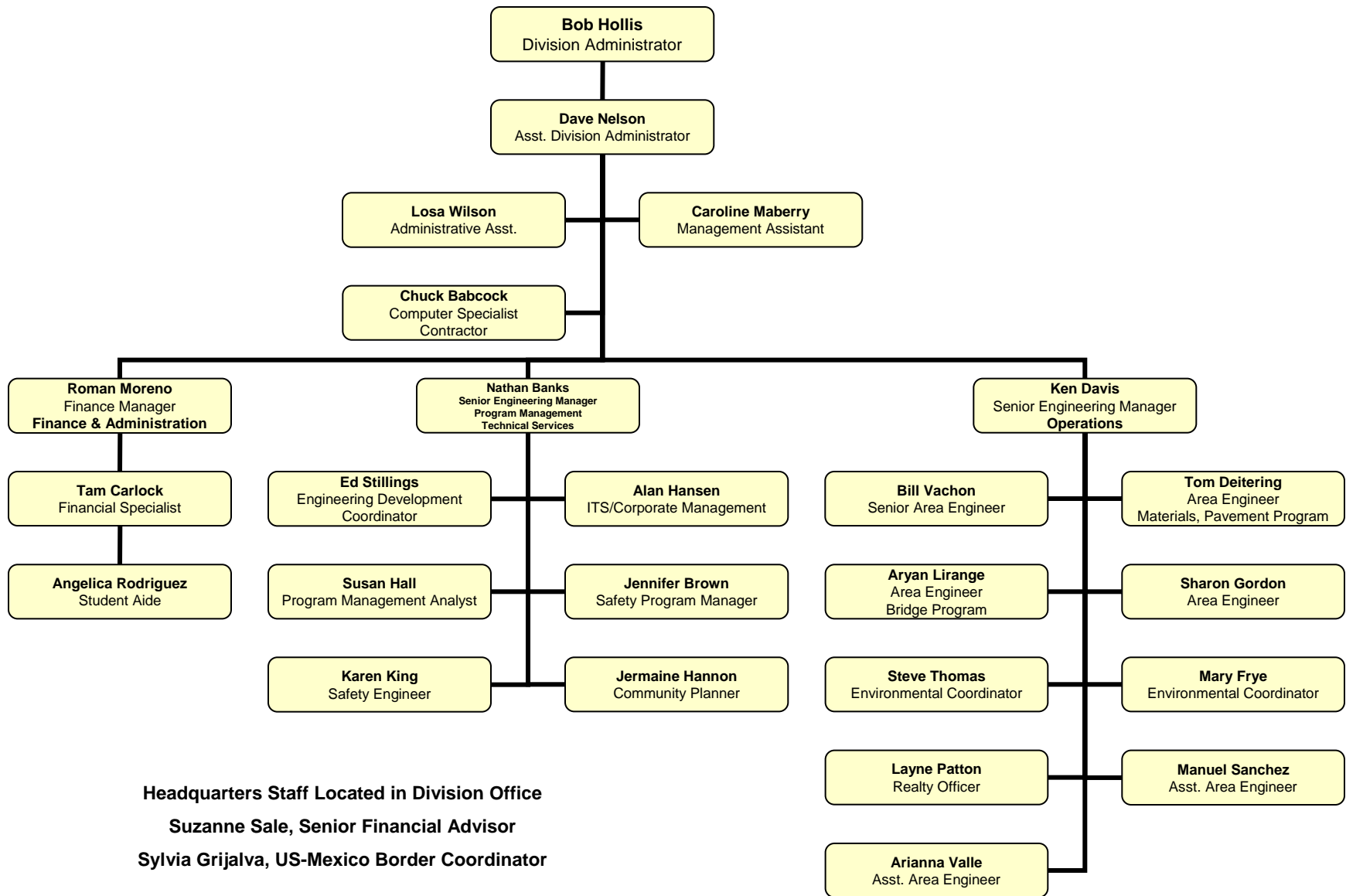


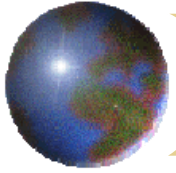
Federal-aid Division Offices

- Front line office in the delivery of the Federal-aid highway program providing guidance and technical assistance regarding Federal transportation programs to State, local, and other Federal agencies.
- There are 52 operating division offices with one office in each state and the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico. Offices are located in the same city as the state departments of transportation which is usually the state capital.



Federal Highway Administration Arizona Division 2008

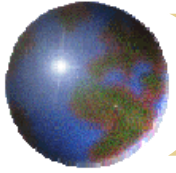

Leaders for National Mobility

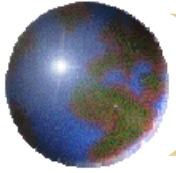
- Provide leadership in defining a future transportation system

Stewards for National Highway Programs

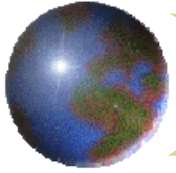

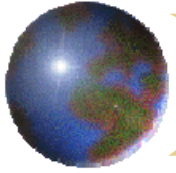
Program In Brief

- **Federal-aid Highway** - generally all routes except rural minor collectors or local roads (As defined by regulation).
- **National Highway System** - Interstate and a number of designated principal urban and rural arterials.



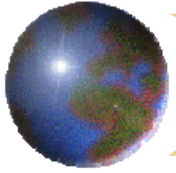
The Major Funding Categories

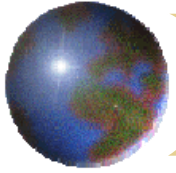

Civil Rights

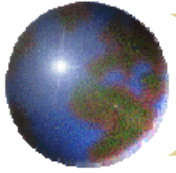
Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964:

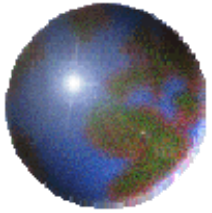
The Reason For FHWA Involvement in the Tribal Partnerships

- Ensure that Tribal Governments understand the transportation planning process and its importance.
- Ensure that Tribal Governments understand how transportation projects are funded and the role of transportation planning in the funding process.
- Ensure that Tribal Governments understand the various funding options which are available to them.
- Ensure that Tribal Governments understand how to access available transportation funds.



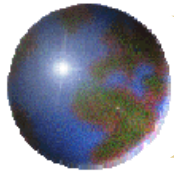
Highway Safety Facts

- Approximately 42,500 fatalities each year.
 - Same as one 747 aircraft crashing every 3 days.
- Approximately 3 million injuries yearly
- Approximately 1 road departure every 21 minutes.
- Approximately 1 intersection fatality every hour.
- Approximately 1 pedestrian fatality every 2 hours.
